



Charleston County Elections Launches Third Year of Popular “I Voted!” Sticker Design Contest

Charleston County Elections is excited to announce the return of the “I Voted!” Sticker Design Contest, continuing a growing tradition of promoting civic engagement through art and creativity.

Now in its third year, the contest invites Charleston County students entering grades K–12 to submit original artwork for a chance to have their design featured on “I Voted” stickers distributed during early voting this fall.

Contest Overview

- **Eligibility:**
 - o Open to all Charleston County residents entering grades K–12
- **Submission Period:**
 - o Opens: Monday, August 4, 2025 at 12:00 p.m.
 - o Closes: Friday, September 12, 2025 at 12:00 p.m.
- **Entry Methods:**
 - o Submissions may be made in any of the following ways:
 - By mail
 - By email
 - In person at the Charleston County Elections office
- **Design Format:**
 - o Artwork may be hand-drawn or created digitally. Full contest guidelines are available at CHSVotes.gov.

Selection Process

- **Finalist Selection:**
 - o A panel of Charleston County Elections staff will select five finalists from each grade group:
 - Grades K–5
 - Grades 6–8
 - Grades 9–12
- **Public Voting:**
 - o Finalist designs will be posted on the [Charleston County Elections Facebook page](#) for public voting.
- **Voting Period:**
 - o Opens: Monday, September 22 at 12:00 p.m.
 - o Closes: Friday, September 26 at 12:00 p.m.
- **How to Vote:** Community members can vote by reacting to their favorite designs on Facebook.

Awards

- **Winning Artists Will Receive:**
 - o Part of a limited-print run of their artwork on “I Voted” stickers used during early voting for municipal elections
 - o A BVRE prize pack, including, but not limited to:
 - o A certificate of achievement
 - o Additional voter engagement materials and gear

This contest supports Charleston County’s efforts to educate future voters and promote creative participation in the electoral process.
