Special Flood Hazard Area: This project is for the acquisition and demolition of the residential structure located in a mapped VE 13 Flood Zone. Confirmation of location in the SFHA was made by reference to the latest Flood Insurance Rate Map, Panel 45019C0484K dated 01/29/2021. The proposed work conforms to all applicable State of South Carolina and local floodplain regulations. The proposed acquisition and demolition project is not located within existing bodies of water and will not have a negative impact on the local floodplain. The proposed acquisition and demolition project has no potential to be impacted by the location in the SFHA. The project will mitigate the structure by removing it from an area of repetitive flooding.

Proposed Work and Purpose:

The County of Charleston is proposing to acquire and demolish a residential property. The purpose of removing this structure is to reduce repetitive flood loss to the residential structure. Upon demolition, the area will be maintained as open space.

Alternative #3: Relocating the structure would be cost prohibitive and the structure would not pass a feasibility study for such a project.

Comments are solicited from the public; local, state or federal agencies; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of the proposed project. The comments should be made in writing and addressed to County of Charleston. <u>All comments are due within 30 days of this notice</u>.
