THERAPEUTIC BEHAVIORAL SERVICES

Overview

Therapeutic Behavioral Services (TBS) is a child development program designed to meet the needs of children (newborn through five years of age) who may have developmental delays due to alcohol and other drug use of their parents. These issues may include Fetal Alcohol Syndrome or problems relating to neglect or abuse.

The goal of this service is to cultivate the psychological and emotional well-being of children and to promote their healthy development. Services are delivered through direct treatment to the child and interventions with the family.

Although the program primarily serves the children whose parents are in inpatient services, some children from the community are also eligible.

Upon enrollment, parents must provide a copy of the child's social security card and a copy of child's current immunization record. If Medicaid is the primary payer source, a copy of the child's Medicaid card must also be presented.

Financial

Most private insurances and Medicaid are accepted and billed on your behalf. Individual arrangements for payment plans can be made at initial intake, or as financial conditions change. Clients who meet federal poverty guidelines may qualify for assistance covering up to 100% of the cost of many services.

Services

Assessments

All children are assessed and given individual treatment plans.

Interventions

Address behavioral concerns, language delays, health issues and social skills.

Parent Education

Classes are designed to provide parents with information regarding child growth and development, and alternative forms of discipline.

Referrals

Referrals can be made to other human services agencies to aid the client and their family in accessing other resources.

Charleston Center's Therapeutic Behavioral Services support the Charleston Center New Life Program which provides long-term treatment in a gender specific residential setting, allowing women in treatment to have up to two of their children (newborn through five years of age) reside with them.
