The Annual Rain Barrel Sale is Underway!

The deadline to order is Sunday, May 26 at 11:00 p.m. and pick-up at two locations

<u>Charleston County Government</u> and the <u>Ashley Cooper Stormwater Education Consortium</u> are offering 100% recycled rain barrels to residents at a discounted price through May 26. It is part of an effort to encourage residents to conserve water resources and protect water quality. The normal retail price is \$129, but through a special partnership, they are \$68. Water collected by the rain barrels can be used for irrigation of container plants, gardens and landscaped beds.

The rain barrels can be purchased through the program's website, <u>https://www.rainwatersolutions.com/products/acsec-ivy</u>,using a credit card.

Rain barrels capture and store rainwater from rooftops. This water would typically be sent down the storm drain carrying potential contaminants and contributing to flooding and erosion issues.
