Tropical Storm Isaias Update #3

Charleston County Emergency Management is ready to respond to the potential impacts from Tropical Storm Isaias. The latest forecast track shows the storm affecting the area Monday afternoon through Tuesday morning as a tropical storm.

- Citizens should avoid unnecessary travel due to possible localized flooding caused by potential heavy rainfall.
- Please remove any items around your home that could cause damage due to the potential for strong wind gusts.
- Please follow directions on traffic and message boards for road closure information and remind the public, "Turn around, Don't drown."
- In the event of possible flooding, citizens are asked not to drive around barricades or drive through standing water.
- Emergency calls to 911 should be reserved to save a life, report a crime or report a fire.
 - DO NOT call 9-1-1 if you have water in your home unless your life is in danger.
 - DO NOT call 9-1-1 to report that your power is out, report the outage to your utility provider.

Charleston County Government will operate on a normal schedule tomorrow, Aug. 3.

- Recycling collections will not be picking up Monday and will operate on a one-day delay.
