Charleston County Encourages Residents to Report Damage from Idalia

Charleston County Government and Charleston County Libraries will reopen for normal business hours on Friday, September 1. Any vehicles parked in Charleston County's downtown parking garages due to the storm need to be removed by 6 p.m. today.

Charleston County Emergency Management continues to monitor Edisto River levels. According to the National Weather Service, the river could be close to major flood levels on Monday, September 5. Residents who live along the river need to be aware of potential rising waters and be prepared to relocate to higher ground if necessary.
