Website Launch & Public Meetings about Future Potential Road Projects and Green Space Preservation

Charleston County is taking public input on projects that could be financed as part of a potential third transportation sales tax at roads.charlestoncounty.org/tst3/.

Charleston County has launched a new website about potential projects to preserve green space, improve roads, bike and pedestrian accommodations, mass transit systems, and fund the extension of the Mark Clark Expressway. Information on the website will be the same information presented at the meetings.

Charleston County staff has worked with local municipalities, the South Carolina Department of Transportation, and the Berkeley-Charleston-Dorchester Council of Governments to discuss potential projects and financing methods.

Charleston County Council is considering placing a sales tax referendum on the November 5, 2024 ballot to fund potential projects.
